All BSA Lifeguard Candidates are expected to abide by the following Code of Conduct:

## CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 01. The Scout Oath and Law will be my guide throughout BSA Lifeguard Camp.
- 02. All BSA Lifeguard Candidates are expected to stay in camp all week and overnight. This is NOT a day camp program.
- 03. BSA Lifeguard Candidates shall set a good example by keeping neatly dressed and presentable. The official Class A and Class B Scout uniform shall be the only acceptable apparel at appropriate specific times.
- 04. BSA Lifeguard Candidates shall attend all scheduled classes and participate as required in cooperation with other unit members and unit leadership.
- 05. BSA Lifeguard Candidates will complete prerequisites prior to attending camp and will complete all homework as assigned by the Merit Badge Counselor. **Failure to do so WILL result in partials**.
- 06. BSA Lifeguard Candidates agree to follow a quiet time and remain within the assigned unit campsite between the hours of taps and sunrise in consideration of Camp Resolute Policies.
- 07. BSA Lifeguard Candidates shall be responsible for keeping tent and personal gear labeled, clean, and neat. In conjunction with other unit BSA Lifeguard Candidates members, the unit campsite.
- 08. As always, the purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs or other illegal substances, and fireworks, explosives, firearms, or like objects is prohibited in accordance with federal, state and municipal laws.
- 09. Serious and/or repetitive behavior violations including use of tobacco, alcohol, drugs, cheating, stealing, dishonesty, swearing, fighting, and cursing may result in expulsion of the BSA Lifeguard Candidate. **THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- 10. BSA Lifeguard Candidates and adult participants shall demonstrate respect for property and be personally responsible for loss, breakage or vandalism of property as a result of their actions.
- 11. BSA Lifeguard Candidates and adult participants shall obey camp program area rules or other activity health & safety rules, and instructions of all activity supervisors and staff. Participants are not permitted to have a vehicle at camp during the program.
- 12. BSA Lifeguard Candidates agree to follow the schedule as directed by the Trail to BSA Lifeguard program in consideration of instructors and other participants.
- 13. BSA Lifeguard Candidates must understand hazing has no place in Scouting. Nor does similar physical or emotional punishment. BSA Lifeguard Candidates must prevent all BSA Lifeguard Candidates from being "initiated" into the unit with a hazing type activity.
- 14. Serious violation of this Code of Conduct by BSA Lifeguard Candidates may result in expulsion from camp.
